RECOMMENDATION:

DISCUSSION:

In April 1999, the Board formally recognized the Adult Services Policy Council (ASPC) as the countywide collaborative tasked with providing planning, development and system design and service integration to improve and expand services for adults and seniors. The ASPC target population is seniors and adults with disabilities who utilize publicly funded health and human services. This Annual Report for FY 2011-2012 provides an overview of the ASPC and identifies major projects, accomplishments and challenges.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT:

The Department of Social Services provides a management employee to act as the Adult Services Coordinator on a half-time basis.

The Adult Services Policy Council members represent over 45 public, non-profit, and private service providers, boards and commissions, and elected officials.
