SUBJECT: Request to re-appoint Tyler Brown, Pam Crabaugh, Karl Hansen, Ian Parkinson, and David Riester to the Behavioral Health Board with a term that expires on June 30, 2017. All Districts.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors re-appoint Tyler Brown, Pam Crabaugh, Karl Hansen, Ian Parkinson, and David Riester to the Behavioral Health Board with a term that expires on June 30, 2017.

DISCUSSION

The Behavioral Health Board exists to act in an advisory capacity to the Board of Supervisors and the County's Behavioral Health Department. It provides advice regarding the implementation of program services and evaluation within the community regarding the effectiveness of those programs. It also plays a role in educating and encouraging the public with regards to the nature of mental health and alcohol and other drug problems, and encourages community support throughout the county for development and implementation of effective behavioral health programs.

The term of each member is for three years, ending June 30 of the appropriate year, and members have the option to request renewal of their term on the year of expiration. Board members are representative of the various geographic regions of the county, various professional sectors, and/or are consumers or family members of consumers. The Behavioral Health Board recommends that Tyler Brown, Pam Crabaugh, Karl Hansen, Ian Parkinson, and David Riester be re-appointed to the Behavioral Health Board and that that appointments expire on June 30, 2017. This action will bring board membership to 17 members with two remaining vacancies.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT/IMPACT

The Behavioral Health Board has made this recommendation. The County Clerk-Recorder has reviewed the request and confirmed that the term of office is accurate and that all posting requirements have been met.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

There are minimal costs associated with the Behavioral Health Board. Community members donate two hours of their time per month to offer advice, consent, and advocacy on behavioral health issues. Meetings are held once a month for two hours in available classroom space. Estimated cost of staff time and supplies is \$550 per month.

RESULTS

The appointment will enable the Behavioral Health Board to continue its role of advice, consent, and advocacy. The Behavioral Health Board members represent various constituencies in the community and provide input to the Behavioral Health Department administration regarding strategic direction and policy.

The Behavioral Health Board helps the Behavioral Health Department of the County Health Agency achieve its mission of promoting safe, healthy, responsible and informed choices concerning mental health and alcohol and other drug use through programs responsive to community needs. That mission contributes to the desired community wide result of a "Healthy Community."
