SUBJECT: Introduction of an amendment to the Growth Management Ordinance, Title 26 of the County Code, to update the fiscal year references for the maximum number of new dwelling units allowed for the Nipomo Mesa area for Fiscal Year 2015-2016 and maintain the 0% Cambria growth rate per fiscal year for the period from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2018; exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Hearing date set for May 19, 2015. Districts 2 and 4.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors introduce the attached ordinance in Attachment 2 and direct the Clerk to set for public hearing and action on May 19, 2015.

DISCUSSION

This ordinance amendment is being introduced on your May 5, 2015 agenda in order to hold a public hearing and take action at your May 19, 2015 meeting. Discussion of the proposed amendment can occur today; however, if *substantial changes* are made to the attached amendment today, the item, as *changed*, will have to be introduced for adoption on May 19, 2015.

The following ordinance is recommended for introduction today for hearing on May 19, 2015:

County File No: LRP2014-00012 -- Hearing to consider a request by the **COUNTY OF SAN LUIS OBISPO** to amend the Growth Management Ordinance, Title 26 of the County Code, to update the fiscal year references for the maximum number of new dwelling units allowed for the Nipomo Mesa area for Fiscal Year 2015-2016 and maintain the 0% Cambria growth rate per fiscal year for the period from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2018. This ordinance amendment affects the land use categories within the communities of Cambria and the Nipomo Mesa area within the North Coast and South County planning areas. Supervisorial District: 2, 4

On August 12, 2008, the Board of Supervisors adopted changes to the Growth Management Ordinance (GMO), Title 26 of the County Code, to provide clean up and housekeeping updates of outdated references and information, and simplification for better understanding and efficiency. These changes have been implemented (Ordinance 3155). During preparation of the clean up amendments planning staff identified that amendments to Section 26.01.070, General Procedures, were necessary prior to June 30, 2014 and these changes have been implemented (Ordinance 3260). Planning staff have identified three (3) amendments to Section 26.01.070, General Procedures that are necessary prior to June 30, 2015. This staff report addresses the proposed amendments to the Growth Management Ordinance.

This ordinance amendment addresses an update of the fiscal year references for the maximum number of new dwelling units allowed in the Nipomo Mesa area for Fiscal Year 2015-2016. The maximum number of new dwelling units allowed in the Nipomo Mesa area for the period of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016 shall not exceed a 1.8 percent increase in the number of existing dwelling from the previous fiscal year. This ordinance amendment also addresses the

maintenance of the 0% Cambria growth rate per fiscal year for the period from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2018.

The proposed ordinance which specifies the exact text to be revised and new text to be inserted by Section for approval by the Board of Supervisors is in Attachment 1. The proposed ordinance for adoption on May 19, 2015 is in Attachment 2.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT/IMPACT

The proposed amendment was referred to South County Advisory Council, North Coast Advisory Council, Cambria Community Services District and the Nipomo Community Services District. County Counsel approved the ordinance as to form and codification.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

No financial impacts to the current county budget.

RESULTS

Introduction of this amendment today will allow it to be heard on May 19, 2015 and to become effective June 18, 2015. Under the amendment, fiscal year date references would be updated to Fiscal Year 2015-2016 for the maximum number of new dwelling units allowed in the Nipomo Mesa area and the 0% Cambria growth rate would be maintained per fiscal year for the period from July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2018. This item is consistent with the countywide goal of promoting well governed communities.
