Subject: Hearing to consider amendments to the Agriculture Element and the Conservation and Open Space Element of the General Plan; amendments to Title 8 (Health and Sanitation Code), Title 19 (Building and Construction Ordinance), and Title 22 (Land Use Ordinance) of the County Code in order to implement the Water Neutral New Development and Water Waste Prevention components of the proposed Countywide Water Conservation Program; and amendment to Ordinance 3274 (County Fee Schedule) to establish new fees associated with the implementation of the proposed Countywide Water Conservation Program. The proposed Countywide Water Conservation Program and associated amendments would affect water use in both new and existing development, including all urban and rural land uses within the unincorporated areas of the county, as well as agricultural operations. The project affects all of the unincorporated portions of the County. Also for consideration is submittal of a resolution amending the Position Allocation Listing for Fund Center 142 – Planning and Building to amend one Limited Term Planner I – III position to December 31, 2019, All Districts



Re: **Proposed amendments to Title 22, agricultural offset ordinance**

At the Paso Basin Advisory Committee (PBAC) meeting on October 15, 2015, the PBAC approved the following language by an 18-1-1 vote.

The PBAC submitted letters on May 21st and July 17th to your Board regarding the proposed amendments to Title 22, the agricultural offset ordinance. The concerns raised in those letters have been addressed in the proposed ordinance from the Planning Commission.

Based on the recent computer model update, the groundwater basin may be manageable by implementing some of the solutions which have been brought forward by the PBAC. However, with a 1% growth rate, the basin may not be sustainable per the Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA).

The offset program is an interim measure to stop further declines in the basin until the Groundwater Sustainability Plan is adopted by the Groundwater Sustainability Agency for the Paso Robles Groundwater Basin.

PBAC requests that the Board of Supervisors adopt the proposed ordinance revisions.
