SUBJECT: Request to approve three appointments to the Workforce Development Board (WDB). All Districts.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board approve the appointments of James J. Brescia to a local education seat (vacated by Julian Crocker on 1/2/15), Tony Ray Hoffman to a labor seat (vacated by Angelo Arevalos on 3/2/15), and Roy Mansibais to a labor seat (vacated by Kimberly Daniels on 4/30/14) to the San Luis Obispo County Workforce Development Board (WDB).

DISCUSSION

On July 22, 2014, the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), the first legislative reform of the public workforce system in 15 years, was signed into law. WIOA supersedes the Workforce Investment Act (WIA) of 1998 and amends the Adult Education and Family Literacy Act of 1998, the Wagner-Peyser Act of 1933, and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and is designed to strengthen and improve the public workforce system and put job seekers back to work by helping workers acquire the skills employers need and help employers access the talent pool needed to compete in a global economy.

The transition from the former legislation (WIA) to the current WIOA began during the 2014-15 program year (as an initial planning period) and will continue through the 2015-16 program year (as the official transition year). The new WIOA program is to be fully in place and compliant as of July 1, 2016. On May 19, 2015, Board item #34, your Board approved the application for the initial local area designation of a local workforce area and the certification and composition of a local workforce development board as one of the initial implementation steps of the WIOA program. On September 22, 2015, Board item #18, your Board adopted the resolution formally designating the Workforce Investment Board and its members as the Workforce Development Board in accordance with WIOA Public Law 113-128 Section 107, changing the Workforce Development Board' title in addition to its composition. The WDB currently has 8 vacancies which are detailed below:

Efforts to achieve full membership for the WDB are ongoing and this item recommends two applicants for appointment to fill vacant Labor Seats and one applicant for appointment to fill the vacant Local Educational Entity Seat.

Mr. Roy Monsibais is the Apprenticeship Coordinator for Local 220 in Nipomo. Mr. Monsibais has extensive knowledge of both the Energy and Building Design and Construction industry clusters. Mr. Monsibais' experience with apprenticeship programs may inform the WDB's approach to developing training and focus on improving the soft skills of job seekers. The WDB has identified Energy and Building Design & Construction as Industry Clusters of Opportunity for the County. Therefore, Mr. Monsibais is recommended for appointment to fill a labor seat a vacant labor seat with a term expiration of June 30, 2019.

Mr. Tony Hoffman is a member of the Tri-Cities Labor Council, serving San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, and Ventura Counties. Mr. Hoffman, although now retired, has over thirty years experience as an elected union officer with knowledge of both the Energy and Building Design & Construction industry clusters. Mr. Hoffman currently serves as a mentor to the current union staff and as an advisor to the Local Union Training Coordinator. The WDB has identified Energy and Building Design & Construction as Industry Clusters of Opportunity for the County. Therefore, Mr. Hoffman is recommended for appointment to fill a vacant labor seat with a term expiration of June 30, 2019.

Dr. James J. Brescia, County Superintendent of Schools, has extensive and varied experience, successfully completing administrative assignments as an elementary, middle and high school principal, migrant education program specialist, superintendent, chief human resources officer, chief business official, and development director. The County Office of Education is the grant recipient of a Career Pathways grant addressing eight career pathways, including: hospitality/tourism, performing arts, patient care with emphasis in sports medicine, design, visual and media arts, engineering design, applications development/software design, public services/legal practices, and manufacturing and product development. The WIOA identifies representatives of local education and career pathways, as members of the WDB. Therefore, Dr. Brescia is recommended for appointment to fill a vacant local education seat a term expiration of June 30, 2017.

The County Clerk Recorder's Office has confirmed that the terms of office are accurate and that the posting requirements have been met.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

This item has no impact on the County's General Fund as WIOA programs are fully financed by federal funding.

RESULTS

Appointment of the new members to the Workforce Development Board will allow the WDB to move closer to fulfilling State mandates for local board composition.
