RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board proclaim the month of January 2016, "San Luis Obispo Human Trafficking Awareness Month" which is commemorated with national and state resolutions and activities that highlight human trafficking awareness in our communities.

DISCUSSION

Each year national and state wide agencies recognize January as "Human Trafficking Awareness Month." San Luis Obispo County created a local collaborative Anti Human Trafficking Task Force one year ago to address this important topic. The public designation of this special month helps to highlight this serious crime and increase our awareness of what communities can do to help the victims deal effectively with offenders and to institute programs to prevent human trafficking.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT/IMPACT

Since August 2014, the District Attorney's Office has provided leadership to support a collaboration of public and private agencies committed to improving our community's response to human trafficking. The San Luis Obispo County Anti-Human Trafficking Task Force joins the Victim/Witness Assistance Center, San Luis Obispo Women's Shelter Program, RISE, the Department of Social Services, the Health Department and others in requesting the Board to make this proclamation highlighting "Human Trafficking Awareness Month."
