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Attached are copies of emails and letters received after the date the staff report was completed.

### Perimeter Trail

We received close to 70 emails requesting an all-weather trail to be constructed within the village's perimeter buffer (adjacent to or parallel to the equestrian trail). Some of the emails requested trails for walking, bicycling, running, or multi-use; most specified that the trail should be paved or constructed out of a surface other than sand. The existing sand surface (for the equestrian trail) was stated to be problematic for walking and dogs. Some of the messages stated the trail was promised to them by the developers. One message also requested a dog park.

*Staff Response: The Woodlands Specific Plan provides the framework for trails within Woodlands Village. Within the buffer that runs around the perimeter of the village, the Specific Plan identifies an equestrian trail throughout the entire perimeter. The buffer is 100 feet wide, except where adjacent to Highway One, where the buffer is 200 feet wide. The Specific Plan, in Exhibit 15 (see next page), identifies a multi-use path within the 200-foot buffer along Highway One but not within the remainder of the buffers around the village. With the approval of each Conditional Use Permit (CUP), the Planning Commission (or Board of Supervisors) must make a consistency determination whether the proposed project, including trails, substantially conforms to Specific Plan. The image on page 3 of this memo reflects the trails plan from the Master CUP (S990187U) that was approved by the Board in 2002. As with Exhibit 15 of the Specific Plan, the approved trails plan for the Master CUP shows a multi-use trail along Highway One only.*

*As part of the approval of this CUP your Commission must find the trails plan, shown in Exhibit G – Trails of the staff report and repeated on page 4 of this memo, to be consistent with those previous plans. The applicant's proposed trail plan (with an equestrian trail only) is consistent with both the Specific Plan and S990187U. However, your Commission may require additional trails or revisions to the trails plan, if you find, based on the evidence in the record, that there is a relationship between the project and the need for the trails based on the findings required for a CUP. Please refer to Attachment – Findings of the staff report.*

*Regarding a dog park: the Specific Plan does not require a dedicated dog park.*

*The applicant has the option to provide additional trails or a dog park for the community. If so, it should be reflected in their project description. Additional conditions of approval may be required.*




Primary Paths & Trails Map

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Letters in Support of the Project

Attached are three letters in support of the project.

*No staff response necessary.*

Email from C. Merrill (1/25/16)

The email raises concerns about the timing of paving Viva Way and requests that Woodlands Mutual Water Company (WMWC) take delivery of supplemental water into its delivery system (rather than NCSD reducing pumping from nearby wells).

*Staff Response: Viva Way is conditioned to be improved prior to the recording of the first map in Phase 2A. The Real Property Division Ordinance, Section 21.05.040 of the County Code gives the applicant the option of constructing the improvements prior to filing the final map or bonding for the construction of the improvements at a later date. Unless bonded for, Viva Way would be constructed early in the development of Phase 2A. Please refer to condition number 30.*

*As stated in staff report, there are two options for utilizing the supplemental water. The water volume may be delivered to the WMWC system or extractions from nearby NCSD wells will be reduced by the same amount to achieve the same goal. Delivery of supplemental water from NCSD to WMWC would likely require approval from the Local Agency Formation Commission. In addition, the Specific Plan requires that the WMWC be the sole water supply for all parcels and development. It is specifically limited to storing, treating and delivering the water of individual overlying parcel owner. Therefore, staff recommends that Phase 2A development be off-set by NCSD reducing pumping from one of their nearby wells rather than WMWC accepting the water delivery from NCSD into their system. Please refer to condition numbers 22 and 23.*

Email from J. Killackey (1/26/16)

The commenter is in support of the project but would like the multi-use trail in Phase 1A to be extended to Dawn Road at Albert Way.

*Staff Response: Improvements to Phase 1A cannot be addressed with this CUP. However, the applicant may elect to provide a trail improvement in Phase 1A, subject to Specific Plan and Land Use Ordinance requirements.*

In my email to you last week I asked you to urge Shea Homes to include walking paths as part of the new Phase 2A application. Shea presented their new plan to the Trilogy residents last Friday, January 22nd. I was pleasantly surprised to see that the plan included a paved walking path in addition to the horse trail. The walking path shown in the presentation was only 5 foot wide and this width doesn't allow for bikes and walkers to safely pass. I would hope that the path would be similar to the existing trail that is next to Route 1 and where it is about 10 feet wide and paved with asphalt.

To expedite the approval Shea Homes dropped the vineyard concept and went back to the original golf course plan. Shea made a big deal about the new vineyard concept in a presentation to Trilogy residents in December 2014 claiming that it would save water, have less impact on the environment, and would account for the fact that golf activity was falling off. They sold me. I believed that it was a good plan.

But something changed their mind and they told us that the vineyard concept was too new an approach and that the county planners would need a lot more time to approve such a radical concept. Shea is most anxious to continue on with building new homes and retaining their current work force and they made a business decision to go back to the original golf course plan. I'm not a golfer so the new plan doesn't affect me although the fact that the vineyard plan would save water makes it a good way to go. Shea told me that they would go back to the vineyard concept in a heartbeat if the county planners would reach a speedy decision.

In any event I would urge you to approve the CUP for Phase 2A. We have lived here in Trilogy for the past 8 years and have always found Shea Homes to be a responsible builder. I am particularly impressed with their push to include roof top solar panels on all new homes to save on electricity use. They have started to employ new irrigation methods and are now adopting artificial turf to save on water.

Getting back to walking paths, I would like to see the extension of the existing path on the western boundary paralleling Route 1 to proceed all the way up to Dawn Road and then around to Albert. Hopefully, this extension could be made as part of the Phase 2A approval.

Dear Andrew

I want to thank you for getting back to me before the meeting next week with the Planning Commission.

May I ask for you to just get back to me on a few points of your discussion before next week's meeting?

VIVA WAY

I am well aware that we would never expect you to pave Viva Way before receiving the approval of the project. Rather, my concern and question is that you are only required to pave Viva AFTER recording the lots and AFTER all the grading.

That is not acceptable to the residents, and you should know your trucks going back and forth to the end of Eucalyptus are going well above

the speed limit on our dirt road we co-own with you, and tearing it up and kicking up dust. Two days ago, one refused to slow down even when I stood in the middle of the road and asked him to slow....he ran me off the road. Could you please address this with and assure me you will do this paving after approval but BEFORE all the work necessary to get to lot recording. What can be your objection to this?

WATER

This is the biggest issue of all. And the updated EIR was just shown to us, we were shocked that we have been deceived and we have reported this to Jay Johnson. In your meeting with the South County Advisory Council, you led the audience to believe the wet connection with NCS D was established and water would be flowing. Now we see you never intended to fill your storage tanks with Santa Maria water but instead reduce pumping at other wells on the mesa near homes THAT ARE CONNECTED BY PIPES TO NCS D. This is the important point. You intend, therefore, to over pump below our nearby properties with your wells and not shift even one drop of water into our area as you build more homes.

I hope the issue is clear...we who surround your property, are entirely dependent on our wells and nobody in our area is or can be without astronomical expense, connected to the NCS D water when the wells run dry. Whereas, if your wells start to run dry, you will then undoubtedly ask for Local Agency Formation Commission approval to turn on the interconnect, to which we your neighbors, are not connected.

Are you willing to bond us that you will pay for our properties to be connected to NCS D or WMWC should our wells run dry because of your overpumping in our area?

Please don't tell us that all the water in the basin depletes equally. You should know by now that this is not true and the overpumping maps show our areas on the test wells to be severely overpumped and very different than the proposed wells of the NCS D that will be pumped less to make up for your overpumping that should instead come from physical water from the Santa Maria system of state water.

I would be very grateful if you could address these two issues before next Thursday, Andrew. I hope you can see why these are valid concerns. We want to support your project, but alas, especially with the new info on the shell game that is being played with water, we will have to appeal the County Board of Supervisors or take other legal action if we cannot assure ourselves of being protected from the consequences of your additional development. Let's please work together and come to some understanding before next week, if possible.

As residents of Trilogy at Monarch Dunes, we would like to ask you to please vote to approve the Phase 2A CUP as proposed. The CUP application for Phase 2A conforms to the original approvals, which were given in 1998 and 2002, with some important new features, such as drought tolerant landscape options, water saving plumbing fixtures and irrigation systems, solar panels standard on every home, Energy Star appliances, double paned windows and state of the art HVAC systems.

As homeowners, we feel that the developer, in partnership with Shea Homes, is committed to completing our community in a responsible manner, keeping the interests of the County, the Nipomo Mesa area and our Monarch Dunes community in mind. As newcomers to the area, we are very impressed with the way that Shea has complied with all of the issues that the County has asked of them, especially related to slow growth and water issues. We so appreciate how the Woodlands Mutual Water Company recycles all of our "gray water" and uses it to water the greens and fairways of the golf courses. We are also aware of the plan they have for the Phase 2A golf course, which will reduce the water usage by 55%. They keep us informed on our water usage issues as well as giving us guidelines as to how to limit our usage.

With approval of the Phase 2A CUP, Shea can move forward and keep all of the skilled workers that they employ to sell and build the homes in our community, which can be upwards of 1,000 people per day. As new buyers move in, they then spend money locally at businesses, restaurants etc., as well as bringing new Property Tax dollars into the county. We have also seen firsthand the philanthropic generosity of the members of Monarch Dunes in their support of many charitable organizations in the surrounding communities.

We know that change is hard and that not everyone wants to see it, but we see all of these changes as progress and as win-win situations for those of us who live here as well as the best interests for the future of the County of San Luis Obispo. This letter is sent to you in support of a decision on January 28<sup>th</sup> to approve the Conditional Use Permit (CUP) application for Phase 2A at Trilogy Monarch Dunes.

Shea Homes has done an outstanding job of protecting and advancing the original vision of Monarch Dunes. The Conditional Use Permit (CUP) application for Phase 2A is in substantial conformance with the original 1998 & 2002 approvals.

The CUP incorporates important new features like:

- Drought tolerant landscaping options
- Water saving plumbing fixtures and irrigation systems
- Improved technology to conserve energy with solar panels standard in every home
- Energy Star appliances and double paned windows
- State of the art HVAC systems including programmable thermostats

The Phase 2A nine hole golf course reduces water use from the estimates in the original environmental document by 55% (from 190 acre-feet per year to 104.3 acre-feet).

After nearly a decade of monitoring the actual data collection by the Woodlands Mutual Water District has shown that home sites at Monarch Dunes use less than ¼ acre feet each year in contrast to the County averages of ½ acre foot per year.


The golf course will be designed and irrigated with a combination of recycled water produced at the water treatment facility and the ground water that isn't drinking water quality.

Golf course will be carefully designed to minimize water use and limiting overhead irrigation, incorporate sophisticated irrigation controllers and moisture monitors and landscaping the out-of-play areas with drought-tolerant plantings



**Nipomo - The Woodlands Trail** - Woodland Trails extend from the end of Eucalyptus to Hwy 1, and follow the perimeter of the Woodlands Trilogy Golf Course, around to Dawn, Camino Caballo, Viva and Mesa Roads. Exercise caution as trees are coming down in preparation for a planned vineyard and more homes at Monarch Dunes. No map available and extensive work on the next phase has rendered woods unsafe! Riding with those who know the area well currently recommended.

Parking is available at the south west corner. The entrance thru the fenced area has been designed especially for horses and NOT quads, etc - and had become quite difficult, but recently a wonderful helper with a tractor scoop, has come and filled it in and made it safe again - THANKS !!! This is a beautiful trail, overlooking the ocean, and golf course; with inner trails through the butterfly preserve, where there's even a picnic table and tie-up for horses at the top of the hill!

A portion of this trail is still unfinished at Camino Caballo and Viva down to Mesa, but there is a safe area along Viva to ride. We understand that the 100 foot public easement around the development in the Phase 2 A and B plan includes NO mention of a walking or bicycle path.

The Developer must feel the resident walkers and bicyclists can use the Nipomo Ride horse trail that surrounds Trilogy.

However, this would mean the residents like walking or riding their bikes in 6" of sand and horse manure, which isn't true.

The current horse trails do not help us, and likely are not used by Trilogy residents.

We want a SLO County Planning Commission REQUIRED all-weather(6' wide asphalt x ~3.5 miles long) walking and bicycle path provided by Shea Trilogy / Woodlands within the exterior 100 foot public easement of Phase 2 A and B.

This would be similar to the current 0.8 mile asphalt path next to holes 2 and 3 of the Old Golf Course, next to Highway 1, across from our house.

We frequently walk and use our road bicycles in the area. We would use these Phase 2 A and B walking and bicycle paths often, and this would reduce bicycle use on the roads, and provide a safer, quieter recreational activity for 1300 Trilogy residents as well as the community.

Please consider the long-term 1300 residents of Trilogy, and the community; instead of the short-term desire to reduce costs for Shea Trilogy / Woodlands.

As a resident homeowner in the Shea Trilogy/Woodlands Community in Nipomo, I am deeply concerned that there is no mention of a pedestrian or bicycle path within the 100 foot public easement around the development in the Phase 2 A and B plan to be reviewed by the commission on January 28, 2016. I am also concerned that the developer, Shea Homes, dismisses our need for a walking trail and states that we can use the Nipomo ride trail for walking and bicycling.

As an avid bicyclist and mountain biker, I know from experience that no ordinary bicycle can be ridden in sand or even ridden safely on a hard surface coated with sand. I am also aware that there is sometimes a conflict between equestrian riders and bicycle riders when using the same trail. Further, this community lacks appropriate walking trails, even to the clubhouse. There is only one safe walking path to the clubhouse, which passes dirty sidewalk past the golf course pro shop, kitchen exhaust fans and dumpsters. That single walking path is heavily used by golf course and kitchen staff in an industrial capacity related to golf and kitchen operations, and is not community-friendly.

Since most of the residents in the community walk for exercise and enjoyment, and many of us ride bicycles, I believe that this shortfall must be addressed. Shea's failure to acknowledge and address this shortfall indicates their lack of concern for residents of the development phases that are completed and nearing completion. Drivers go way too fast and are often negligent of not paying attention to walkers, joggers, and cyclists. I once tried to ride my bike on the sandy section of Dawn Rd. and actually fell due to the instability of the sand beneath my wheels. It was impossible to ride in the sand. It would be wonderful to have a path separate from the streets where we would not have the fear of getting hit. We are amazed at the great number of truly active residents within our neighborhood. Having this path would truly enhance our community for everyone who lives here. It would be one more benefit that would encourage future residents to buy here.

We encourage you to present our feelings and opinions to the Planning Commission in the next meeting on January 28, 2016 and appreciate your support of a paved path.
