RECOMMENDATION

DISCUSSION

In April 1999, the San Luis Obispo Board of Supervisors formally recognized the Adult Services Policy Council as the countywide collaborative group tasked with providing planning, development and system design and service integration to improve and expand services for adults and seniors. The Adult Services Policy Council target population is seniors and adults with disabilities who utilize publicly funded health and human services. This Annual Report for FY 2014-15 (Attachment 1) provides an overview of the Adult Services Policy Council and identifies major projects, accomplishments and challenges.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT/IMPACT

The Department of Social Services provides a management employee to act as the Adult Services Coordinator on a half-time basis.

The Adult Services Policy Council members represent over 50 public, non-profit, and private service providers, boards and commissions, and elected officials.
