Dear Sirs and Madam,

We, the undersigned local group representing a broad cross-section of the criminal and juvenile justice systems, respectfully request that the Mustang Stampede Project be provided funding.

Mustang Stampede proposes using the California Military District, Camp San Luis Obispo, as a State cybersecurity training center to form the hub of a cybersecurity and forensic training program that trains and educates National Guard Cyber Protection Teams (CPT), law enforcement, state and local personnel, and students. Because of the formative partnership with the California State University system and the National Guard, the site could be built out rapidly as a "proof of concept" in addition to providing training in the short- and long-term. The site would then serve as a focal point to develop other related programs.

A fully functional e-crime and critical infrastructure forensics training complex provides numerous advantages to California, both technically and in terms of enhanced law enforcement capability. Importantly, it assists the new mission for the California National Guard to support the defense of California's critical infrastructure. As requested by the President and Governor Brown to find new ways to share and execute the Cyber Mission, the Cal Poly Cybersecurity Joint Project Mustang Stampede develops the critical infrastructure forensics training complex through working partnerships with the California Highway Patrol (CHP), California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES), California Department of Justice (DOJ), the California Military Department (CMD) and the entire California State University (CSU). These key stakeholders will receive services, training, and support.


Mustang Stampede allows state and local Law Enforcement and National Guard entities to address needs and fill gaps across the entire cybercrime spectrum. Criminal justice is a system; the activities and priorities of one component impact the activities and priorities of the other components. Only when the system is functioning as a seamless whole can public safety truly be protected. We are not spending enough resources evenly across California to even impact the increase in Cybercrime. More must be done to support less technically developed cyber regions like the Central Coast. As the High Tech Crime Centers develop, their response to cybercrime activities, the criminal element moves to where they are not going to be caught. Regions like the Central Coast are experiencing that increase in cyber-crime activity and we are in need of support to prosecute it!

Critical collaboration occurs among law enforcement agencies through training together to execute multijurisdictional cyber task forces, which enable law enforcement agencies to join together in targeting regional cybercrime organizations.

In partnership with the Department of Justice Office of Justice Programs, State Administering Agencies (SAAs) are engaged in a concerted strategy to invest Byrne JAG dollars in evidence - based, evidence-generating, and research-supported programs. In tough economic times, it is more important than ever that Byrne JAG grants support proven strategies for steering children away from delinquent behavior, effective incarceration and treatment strategies, and meaningful support services to individuals returning to their communities after incarceration.

Cyber-crime is growing in staggering numbers, added to that the potential to BE called in to protect California Critical Infrastructure is imminent. Mustang Stampede gives California the first place to develop, train and rest new ways of prosecuting Cybercrime.

We appreciate and respect the challenges you face. We come together on this letter, not simply to support a critical new program, but to ask that you recognize the critical unifying role Mustang Stampede will play in preventing attacks on critical infrastructure and fighting cybercrime in neighborhoods across our state. We ask you to support this work by providing funding for the Mustang Stampede Project.
