Subject: Notice of Public Hearing On Ordinance to Increase Sewer/Waste Disposal Rate in County Service Area No. 1F (CSA 1F) in Nipomo

Dear Property Owner within CSA 1F:

The County of San Luis Obispo (“the County”) is considering adopting an ordinance that would increase sewer/waste disposal rate charges within CSA 1F. In compliance with Article XIII D of the California Constitution, a part of what is commonly called Proposition 218; this notice letter provides important information for affected property owners. Specifically, this notice provides information on the sewer/waste disposal rate charge increase proposal and the procedures for protesting the proposal.

Accordingly, a public hearing will be held on Tuesday, June 7, 2016, in the San Luis Obispo County Board of Supervisors Chambers, 1055 Monterey Street, San Luis Obispo, CA 93408, for the purpose of considering a proposed ordinance that would increase sewer/waste disposal rate charges within CSA 1F in Nipomo.

All hearing items are scheduled for 9:00 a.m. To determine the placement of this item on the agenda, the agenda can be viewed the Wednesday afternoon before the scheduled hearing date on the internet at www.slocounty.ca.gov or in paper form in Room D430 of the County Government Center.

At this hearing, property owners may submit written and oral protests and comments or questions to the Board regarding the proposed sewer/waste disposal rate charge increase. County staff will be at the hearing and will be available to answer questions regarding the proposed sewer/waste disposal rate charge increase. At the close of this hearing, any written protests will be tallied by the County Clerk. The discussion below is organized based on questions we anticipate you may have.

WHY AM I RECEIVING THIS NOTICE LETTER?

Proposition 218 requires that notices be mailed to the owners of property upon which the sewer/waste disposal rate charge is proposed to be increased. Our records indicate that you are a property owner within CSA 1F in Nipomo that will be subject to the proposed sewer/waste disposal rate charge increase. As a result, the County is providing you notice about the proposed sewer/waste disposal rate charge increase and the public hearing.

WHEN WILL THE SEWER/WASTE DISPOSAL RATE CHARGE BE INCREASED?

The proposed sewer/waste disposal rate charge increase will be effective the first billing of FY 2016-17 taxes, due December 10, 2016.

WHAT IS THE AMOUNT OF THE PROPOSED SEWER/WASTE DISPOSAL RATE CHARGE INCREASE?

The current monthly sewer/waste disposal rate for CSA 1F is \$53.91 per month, or \$646.92 per year. In the first year, FY 2016-17, the proposed rate increase would raise sewer/waste rate by \$12.18 (\$1.02 per month) to \$54.93 per month, or \$659.10 per year. The proposed changes to the basic bi-monthly sewer/waste disposal rate charge rate schedule is shown below:

<p>The County Collection System Operations Charge shown above shall be automatically adjusted annually every July 1st by the Consumer Price Index (CPI) to reflect increases in the cost of County operations. Pursuant to Government Code 53756, the NCS D District Sewer charge component shall be adjusted annually every July 1st by the increase charged by NCS D.</p> <p>* NCS D rates change on a calendar year, effective Jan 1st. County rates are charged on a fiscal year of July 1 to June 30th. NCS D monthly rate is \$44.47 for the first 6 months from July to December, and \$45.89 for the second six months, from January to June.</p>				

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED SEWER/WASTE DISPOSAL RATE CHARGE INCREASE?

CSA 1F provides sewer/waste disposal service to approximately 70 homes in the Galaxy Park Area of Nipomo. CSA 1F operates the sewer collection system connected to each home, and the CSA 1F system then connects to the Nipomo Community Services District (NCS D) sewer system. The wastewater is treated and disposed by the NCS D. Effective January 1, 2016, The NCS D increased rates from \$529.92 to \$533.58 annually to CSA 1F for each home connected to the sewer system. This amount will continue to increase over the next several years through a series of rate increases. The NCS D agenda item from November 12, 2015, describes the need for the most recent rate increase (Website address to reference NCS D Agenda Item: <http://ncsd.ca.gov/wp-content/uploads/2015/07/E11.pdf>).

CSA 1F funds the charges from NCS D for sewer service as a pass through to the property owners in the district. Charges for the County’s operation and maintenance of the collection system, separate from NCS D’s system, are not proposed to be increased this fiscal year but would be increased by the Consumer Price Index for subsequent years through fiscal year 2020/21.

Sewer/waste disposal charges are computed annually and placed as a separate charge on property tax bills.

HOW DO I PROTEST?

Submit a Written Protest. If you oppose the proposed sewer/waste disposal rate charge increase, your protest must be submitted in writing to be considered, even if you plan to attend the public hearing. If written protests are submitted by property owners of a majority of the affected parcels, the proposed sewer/waste disposal rate charge increase cannot be imposed. Electronic mail protests will not be formally considered in calculating a majority protest. Protests must be signed by the protester and contain the address and the Assessor's Parcel Number of the affected property. Please indicate that it is the sewer/waste disposal rate charge increase that you are protesting.

Property owners may mail or deliver their written protests to the County at County Clerk/Recorder's Office, Attn: Clerk of the Board, 1055 Monterey St. Suite D120, San Luis Obispo, CA 93408 in a manner that ensures receipt by the County no later than the close of the public hearing on June 7, 2016. Property owners may also present or withdraw written protests at the hearing on June 7, 2016. Only those written protests that are actually received by the County prior to the close of the June 7, 2016 hearing will be considered. If any person wishing to protest has a disability that would prevent them from complying with the requirements of this paragraph, please contact Kellie Burns at (805) 781-5278.

If you agree with the need for the proposed sewer/waste disposal rate charges, no action on your part is required.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF THERE IS MAJORITY PROTEST?

If property owners of a majority of the parcels upon which the sewer/waste disposal rate charge increase is proposed for imposition submit written protests on a timely basis, then the Board of Supervisors will not be able to increase the proposed sewer/waste disposal rate charge ordinance. Therefore, sewer/waste disposal rate charge revenues would be insufficient to cover current and ongoing operations and maintenance expenditures. An alternative rate increase proposal and process would need to be pursued in order to prevent the system from running out of money.
