SUBJECT: Submittal of a resolution to levy assessments for Flood Control and Water Conservation District, Zone 4 (Santa Maria River Levees). District 4.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board, acting as the Board of Supervisors for the San Luis Obispo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District:

1. Approve the subject resolution and levy assessments as stipulated therein.
2. Direct the Clerk to file the approved resolution with the Auditor/Controller/Treasurer/Tax Collector (ACTT) no later than August 10, 2016.

## **DISCUSSION**

Since 1979, Flood Control Zone 4 has financed its share of the cost of maintaining the Santa Maria Levees through 25¢ per acre benefit assessments. The 25¢ per acre benefit assessment is based strictly on acreage with a minimum of \$5.00 per parcel, per year, and is expected to be adequate through 2016-17. The benefit assessment is authorized per Section 13 of the San Luis Obispo County Flood Control and Water Conservation District Act, Act 7205 of the California Water Codes, --Uncodified.

The assessment rate has been the same since 1979. The current rate was in effect when Proposition 218 was passed. No vote on these assessments is required.

## **OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT/IMPACT**

The Auditor/Controller/Treasurer/Tax Collector (ACTT) collects the charges, and places the charges on the tax roll and County Counsel has approved the Resolution as to legal form and effect. The County Clerk will file the Resolution with the County ACTT.

The Santa Barbara County Flood Control District is the lead agency in performance of the levee maintenance. It also pays the majority of the cost as the principal benefit is to property owners within Santa Barbara County.

## **FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS**

Section 13 of the San Luis Obispo County Flood Control Act 7205 allows for the recovery of costs incurred while maintaining and improving the Santa Maria Levees. This revenue (approximately \$3,300) is included in the proposed Flood Control Zone 4 budget for 2016-17 and, other than interest, is the sole source of revenue for the district.

## **RESULTS**

Approximately \$3,300 will be added to the property tax bills for parcels within Flood Control Zone 4. See Resolution Exhibit for amount per parcel. The revenue will be used to pay Santa Barbara County for Santa Maria levee maintenance. That maintenance is necessary for maintaining a desirable level of service on the levee which provides for a healthy safe community.
