SUBJECT: Request to approve an agreement with Arroyo Grande in Bloom allocating \$2,000 from District Four Community Project Funds – Fund Center 106 to be used for expenses associated with creating the butterfly garden and Monarch Butterfly artwork project at the South County Regional Center. District 4.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors approve the agreement allocating \$2,000 from District Four Community Project Funds – Fund Center 106 to Arroyo Grande in Bloom.

## **DISCUSSION**

The Arroyo Grande in Bloom, a non-profit organization, was formed to encourage and support a public art program that reflects the City of Arroyo Grande's heritage, culture and character. The organization has planned and carried various projects within the City of Arroyo Grande including the development of a "Walk of History" where figures from history that have and contributed to the history of City will be honored. The first person to be honored was Harriet Quimby. Another public art project is the planned placement of 3-foot fiberglass roosters throughout Arroyo Grande. These roosters will be decorated by local artists, service organizations and school children. The next project is the creation of art that will feature the Monarch Butterfly. A butterfly garden will be created at the South County Regional Center with plaques placed throughout.

The \$2,000 in County funds will be used towards expenses associated with developing the butterfly garden and Monarch Butterfly artwork at the South County Regional Center in Arroyo Grande.

## **OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT/IMPACT**

Volunteers with Arroyo in Bloom will oversee the development and creation of the garden and art work.

## **FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS**

Funding in the amount of \$2,000 will be allocated from Community Project Funds – Fund Center #106 to Arroyo Grande in Bloom who will oversee the development of the butterfly garden and art work.

## **RESULTS**

A butterfly garden will be created at the South County Regional Center, near the County Library, that will attract the thousands of Monarch butterflies that spent their winters on the Central Coast. The center piece of the garden will be a statue of the Monarch butterfly. The garden will be a place for the residents and visits to enjoy.
