

**FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN LUIS OBISPO  
AND SOUTH COUNTY YOUTH COALITION, INC.**

This FIRST AMENDMENT is entered into by and between the County of San Luis Obispo, a public entity in the State of California (herein after referred to as the "County") and South County Youth Coalition, Inc. (hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor").

WHEREAS, the County and Contractor entered into an Agreement on June 16, 2015, for a term beginning July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2017 (the "Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the San Luis Obispo County Community Corrections Partnership approved amendment of the Contractor's Building Bridges to Success program (the "Program") on May 16, 2016; and

WHEREAS, both parties wish to amend the current Agreement to reflect and incorporate the amended Program;

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. **EXHIBIT A, SCOPE OF WORK/WORK PLAN FORMAT**, of the Agreement, shall be amended by deleting the current provision and replacing it with the following:

"Over a two-year period, South County Youth Coalition's project, "Building Bridges to Success", will enhance South County Services Affirming Family Empowerment (SAFE) Family Resource Centers' services by supporting youth at-risk of becoming involved in criminal activity to participate in enrichment activities and/or educational or occupational opportunities. The program will also target South County Latino youth who have been referred to the Probation Department or are already involved with the Probation Department by piloting a youth mentoring and parent support component. The mentor will also serve as a liaison between Latino families whose youth are involved with the Probation Department and probation officers who work with these youth. The intent is to address and remove any communication and cultural gaps that exist. The mentor will work directly with the targeted youth and their families to strengthen family relationships and increase communication between the youth, parent(s) and the Probation Department. The mentor will also provide referrals to other agencies as needs are identified."

2. Section 4. **GRANT**, of the Agreement, shall be amended by deleting the term "\$10,000" and replacing it with "\$15,000."
3. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused their duly authorized representative to execute this First Amendment to Agreement between the County of San Luis Obispo and South County Youth Coalition, Inc.

### SCOPE OF WORK/WORK PLAN FORMAT

The program will also target South County Latino youth who have been referred to the Probation Department or are already involved with the Probation Department by piloting a youth mentoring and parent support component. The mentor will also serve as a liaison between Latino families whose youth are involved with the Probation Department and probation officers who work with these youth. The intent is to address and remove any communication and cultural gaps that exist. The mentor will work directly with the targeted youth and their families to strengthen family relationships and increase communication between the youth, parent(s) and the Probation Department. The mentor will also provide referrals to other agencies as needs are identified.

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**Project/Program Outputs:**

- A minimum of 93 youth will be assisted to participate in enrichment activities and/or educational / employment opportunities by the end of FY2016-17.
- A minimum of 80 youth will be assessed for other service needs by the end of FY2016-17.
- A minimum of 20 youth involved with Probation and their families will receive one on one parenting education, mentoring or resource connection by the end of FY 2016-17.

**Project/Program Outcomes:**

- At least 75% of previously/currently incarcerated youth who participate in the program will not be re-booked within one year of participating.
- At least 75% of at-risk youth who participate in the program will not be booked within one year of participating
- At least 90% of parents/guardians will report improved communication within the family.
- At least 90% of parents/guardians will report an improved understanding on how the Juvenile Justice System works and what their role is in supporting the youth to successfully complete their probation terms.
