SUBJECT: Request to approve a renewal grant agreement (Clerk's File) in the amount of \$86,877 for the term of FY 2016-2017 for a Criminal Restitution Compact (CRC) with the Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board submittal of a resolution authorizing the District Attorney to sign the State agreement and other documents related to receipt of this grant. All Districts.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board:

- 1 Approve a renewal grant agreement in the amount of \$86,877 for a Criminal Restitution Compact (CRC) grant from the Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board for Fiscal Year 2016-17; and
2. Approve and direct the Chair to sign the resolution authorizing the District Attorney to sign the State agreement and other documents related to the receipt of this grant.

DISCUSSION

As part of their court duties in handling criminal cases, Deputy District Attorneys are charged with making requests to the court for appropriate restitution fines and orders for all convicted offenders and for appropriate diversion fees for all offenders placed on diversion. The intent of this grant agreement is to provide funding for trained personnel in the District Attorney's Office to work with the county criminal justice system, including the Courts and the Probation Department, to ensure that restitution fines and orders are properly administered in accordance with applicable statutes. Throughout the State, Criminal Restitution Compacts (CRC) between District Attorney offices and the State have been implemented and are ongoing with successful results. The agreement with the State is for one fiscal year.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT/IMPACT

County Counsel has reviewed this agreement as to form and legal effect.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Under the terms of this contract, \$86,877 is available from the State for Fiscal Year 2016-17. No matching funds are required. The contract will reimburse the District Attorney's Office for a 0.50 FTE Paralegal position, additional hours as authorized beyond part-time allocation, if necessary, overhead charges, office supplies and required training. There is no impact on the General Fund.

RESULTS

The renewal of this grant will enable the District Attorney's Office to provide a trained 0.50 FTE Paralegal position to work with the County criminal justice system to ensure that restitution fines and orders are properly administered in accordance with applicable statutes.
