Dear Board of Supervisors,

This letter is in regard to item #23 on the Tuesday July 19th agenda, regarding the "transportation evaluation and the 2015 Avila Circulation Study".

My property is at 220 San Miguel St in Avila, and I and my tenant are heavily impacted by the increased traffic. In addition to drunk and careless driving, people park in my driveway, they drive at excessive speeds, and exiting San Miguel St has become very dangerous as there's minimal visibility and people park in the turnout lane. To address parking, I suggest that fewer cars enter the town of Avila. During summer, Bellevue Charter School grounds could be used for a park and ride. School buses could bring people in for weekends and concerts. Possibly, those using the buses could receive discount coupons for snacks, etc.

Secondly, residents would have parking passes. Unpermitted parking would be ticketed, as already exists around Cal Poly residential areas.

Thirdly, speed bumps would be installed on San Miguel St to prevent it from being a speedway to the parking lot.
