Dear Supervisors:

This letter is being submitted by Friends of Wild Cherry Canyon, a group of hundreds of concerned citizens from Avila Beach and others who care about the quality of life and well-being on the California Central Coast. We are presenting this letter for your July 26, 2016 afternoon session regarding the closure of Diablo Canyon and the proposed Dream Resolution.

We respectfully request that you adopt and implement the Dream Resolution to ensure the conservation – rather than the development – of the 12,000 acres that surround Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant (the “Diablo Lands”) including the 2500-acre Wild Cherry Canyon property.

The Dream Resolution is in response to the 2000 Measure A/Dream Initiative, which overwhelmingly passed in 2000. Indeed, 75% percent of SLO County voters urged PG&E via the Board of Supervisors to conserve all of the Diablo Lands after the plant’s closure. Measure A was supported by all five then-San Luis Obispo County Supervisors, a long and bipartisan list of elected officials, business groups, environmental groups, and PG&E itself (Missy Hobson, PG&E, the Tribune 10/20/1999).

Our request for conservation is consistent with PG&E’s own intentions. As stated in the report, The Local Impacts of Decommissioning the Diablo Canyon Nuclear Power Plant:

"A likely scenario [for the Diablo Lands] would be similar to the Hearst San Simeon Ranch agreement, where PG&E would offer to sell whatever development rights the company retains to the Coastal Conservancy. Hiking and bicycle paths would likely be constructed on the property as an extension to Montana de Oro State Park, adjacent to Los Osos. If some portion of the property surrounding Diablo Canyon is opened for recreational use, new hiking, biking and surfing venues could be provided to visitors."
