SUBJECT: Submittal of a resolution amending the Traffic Regulation Code to establish angled parking on North and South Third Streets, Cayucos; and Encina Avenue, Santa Margarita.

RECOMMENDATION

It is our recommendation that your Honorable Board adopt the attached resolution amending the County's Traffic Regulation Code pertaining to angled parking.

DISCUSSION

North and South Third Streets, Cayucos

The Department of Public Works received a request from the Cayucos Citizen's Advisory Council to look at making Third Street, a one-way couplet, and place angled parking on the park side on the roadways. The initial concern stemmed from the desire to eliminate long-term nuisance parking near the park.

While investigating the location, staff found that the proposal would reduce the potential of a vehicle conflict at the intersections of Third Street with Ocean and Pacific Avenues, and that the majority of traffic currently treated the roads as if they were one-way. Staff also discovered that the number of parking spaces could be increased along Third Street.

Staff also evaluated but rejected other options. The roadway width was too narrow to place angled parking on the southern part of South Third Street. Placing parking on the north part of North Third Street would interfere with the parking in front of the Sea Shanty restaurant. Therefore, placing angled parking at these locations would negatively affect the adjacent properties and is not recommended.

A survey was also distributed to the businesses, residents and property owners along Third Street and approximately 66% of the returned surveys indicated support for the proposed changes. The proposal and the survey results were evaluated by the Cayucos Citizen's Advisory Council and is supported.

Staff recommends that the angled parking be installed where there is sufficient road width to support it. An additional item on the consent agenda would establish Third Street as a one-way couplet.

Encina Avenue, Santa Margarita

The recently completed Santa Margarita Tavern also completed angled parking along Encina Avenue in front of the business. This is consistent with historic parking at this location that included vehicles parking perpendicular with part of the parking area being on private property. The angled parking keeps the vehicles within the right-of-way, allows for pedestrian passage, and maximizes available parking at this high demand location. Staff recommends making this location angled parking.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT/IMPACT

The California Highway Patrol and the Sheriff's Department enforce the Vehicle Code on County Roads. The Cayucos Citizen's Advisory Council has reviewed the proposals and supports the changes. County Service Area 23 Advisory Committee reviewed Encina Avenue angled parking at their January meeting.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Posting signs and marking will cost approximately \$8,000. This is within the Road Fund's budgeted amount for this activity.

RESULTS

Adoption of this resolution will enhance County road safety and operations by assuring traffic flow and increase parking, thus improving community livability.
