SUBJECT: Request to declare the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) 42 vehicle (2005 Ford 4X4 Type 1 Ambulance) surplus property and authorize sale to Cambria Community Healthcare District by 4/5 Vote. All Districts.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Board:

1. Approve request to declare Emergency Medical Services (EMS) 42 (2005 Ford 4X4 Type 1 Ambulance) surplus property; and
2. Authorize sale of the surplus property to Cambria Community Healthcare District by 4/5 vote.

DISCUSSION

In 2002, San Luis Obispo County Fire obtained a response vehicle assigned to Station 42. Rehab 42 (RHB 42) is a 2005 Ford 4X4 Type 1 Ambulance. It provided a climate-controlled environment to place a patient while awaiting an Emergency Medical Services (EMS) helicopter or ground ambulance. The original vehicle was called EMS 42 as it responded to mostly emergency medical calls by the EMS Platoon (Paid Call Firefighters) in California Valley.

In 2011, the EMS Platoon disbanded. In 2014, this specialized vehicle at Station 42 was now no longer needed as it rarely responded. In 2020, it was due for replacement, but the County Fire Fleet Manager determined that it was surplus to the needs of San Luis Obispo County Fire.

It was decided to replace the specialized vehicle with a Utility Truck instead. County Fire was approached by Cambria Health Care District and inquired if we were interested in selling EMS 42 to them. County Fire feels this would be an excellent cooperative effort to fill a need locally and not auctioning off the vehicle. Kevin Cox, County Fire's Fleet Manager did research and determined a fair market value of \$15,000. In the attached letter, Timothy Benes, Operations Manager for Cambria Community Healthcare District, has offered to pay the full asking price for the EMS 42.

Government Code Section 25365(a) allows the Board of Supervisors, with a four-fifths vote, to authorize the sale of surplus property to another public agency within the County. In accordance with Government Code Section 25365(c), notice of the recommended action was published in a newspaper of general circulation one time at least one week prior to this meeting of the Board of Supervisor. Notice was published in the public notice section of The Tribune / The Cambrian.

OTHER AGENCY INVOLVEMENT/IMPACT

County Counsel was consulted regarding the proper procedure under state law for transferring county assets to public agencies within the county.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

The unanticipated revenue from the sale will fall to the General Fund at year end in the way of Fund Balance available.

RESULTS

Since EMS 42 is no longer of any use to San Luis Obispo County Fire, declaring it surplus would be fiscally responsible. Selling it to Cambria Community Healthcare District would be a cooperative effort to fill their needs and continue to strengthen a good working relationship that County Fire has with the community.
